Acting by the need of the hour HCSC started the plasma donation campaign for facilitation the plasma donation to the needy. WOMEN'S FORUM

STREE: The name reflects the vision - She Triumphs through Respect, Equality and Empowerment, in short "STREE". The program intends to empower the women at grassroot level. The basic support system available for women in distress, the redressal mechanisms in place and the law of the land to empower, protect them are being spread through awareness sessions.

Women's empowerment is an important goal in achieving sustainable development worldwide. Although, much has been spoken about women empowerment we have a lot to achieve. Unreported cases of domestic violence, shows lack of awareness among women adds up to the reason for not speaking up. We need to empower these women to speak up for themselves and never be a victim of injustice.

Considering the current scenario, Hyderabad City Security Council and Hyderabad City Police came up with a program and launched it on the eve of the then International Women's Day with the theme "EachforEqual", a program for women's empowerment that will be sustainable and impactful.

Even during the pandemic, we have conducted trainings virtually to help our women volunteers on various issues of women in the society and ways to overcome them. In the coming weeks we would be giving a basic legal training to the volunteers to make them aware of the sections which are prevalent for violence against women.

The Pilot project of the program started off in June 2020 in Golconda PS area of Asif Nagar Division, West Zone. The primary motive was to create a platform for women from various walks of the community to come together, to facilitate women and police to work together on the issues like safety and security of Women and girls within their locality. Also, every woman should be made aware about their rights, entitlements and laws. This program was created to help woman identify the local issues that affect women's security and take action against all forms of violence and become leaders at grassroot level or the community level. Over a period of time, we have around 100 volunteers from Asif Nagar Division and training is been imparted to them both virtually and physically.



Some key elements of the program are:

- Capacity building programmes to groups.
- Awareness programmes at community level.
- Need based training to the volunteers, sharing of experiences. Turning one volunteer experience into another person's learning and a knowledge base for the future.
- Conduct of workshops for building their capacities so that Information and knowledge will reach to the entire community.
- Police are involved with the community at different levels resulting in joint action.
- Sensitised and people friendly police working together with the community.
- Improved approachability and an enabling environment is created for women to approach the PS for any support.
- Decrease in crime against women & girls through community participation and preventive action.
- Security and safe spaces ensured for women across the city of Hyderabad.

TRAFFIC FORUM ACTIVITIES



The idea of the program is to make young children between grade 4 and 9 as cops of the family and they would ask their parents, relatives, drivers and friends to follow traffic rules strictly. The Hyderabad City Security Council with the support of Hyderabad City Police & Hyderabad Traffic Police have launched the program on 14 Jul 2020. A video in this regard, in which a child acting as traffic cop and asking her parents to follow the rules was released by the Commissioner of Police Sri. Anjani Kumar IPS, Hyderabad City. The program has been developed on the line of our chairman who keeps saying – "All citizens are cops and all cops are citizens". As a society we are all collectively responsible for coexisting. The program has been very successful so far. We have touched 35 schools covering 4500 students. While many of the children were aware of the traffic rules, all were excited about implementing them by becoming WeCoP of the family. The overwhelming response from children and school management makes to do more of the good work. We strive to reach out to the whole of the city.



The key elements of the program are:

- a. Traffic safety rules
- b. The importance of following the rules
- c. Will encourage them to become the WeCoP of their families
- d. Instill in them a feeling of pride in taking up this role

AUTO AND CAB DRIVER SENSITIZATION

The program is a joint initiative of HCSC and Hyderabad Traffic Police to create awareness on traffic and gender sensitization among auto and cab drivers. The program aims to educate cab and auto drivers about friendly behaviour towards women passengers. Also, the program creates awareness about the consequences of any mischief, inappropriate behaviour with women passengers. The legal consequences and punishments as per the law of land are also briefed upon. SHE teams are also part of the program to communicate the fact that many women police officers are out there keeping vigil for wrongdoers.

Brief reasons for traffic violations, accidents and the consequences are also touched upon. The need to strictly to abide by the traffic rules for the safety of self and for those on the road are covered in detail. The reaction of public and drivers in case of emergency, calling ambulance, rushing the victim to nearby hospital are explained to the participants. The program is conducted in the Traffic Training Institute bus at various traffic junctions of the city for better coverage and outreach.





TRAFFIC FARISHTEY

As its rightly said there is nothing stronger than a volunteer's heart, the program Traffic Farishtey is about volunteers coming out to assist the traffic police in handling the traffic. The volunteers are trained upon Basic Life Support (BLS), Emergency first aid addressing and are trained upon basics of traffic handling. The volunteers are trained upon how to behave with public, be informative about traffic rules and consequences. The reporting mechanism in case of any emergency and reporting of violations. The program was launched on 27 Mar 2021 marking the culmination of the Road safety week.



We have started this program with some ten volunteers and we are now close to 100 volunteers. The volunteers will be given the provision of selecting the junction and working in close liaison with the traffic police at the junction.

Virtual Run for road Safety: HCSC along with Hyderabad Traffic Police conducted a virtual run for spreading awareness on road and safety. The event was conducted virtually at 25 police stations participating in the event over live video streaming. There was equal amount of civilian participation also for the event which was kick started by the Hon. Home Minister for the state of Telangana, Shri. Mohammed Mahmood Ali.

















CYBER SECURITY FORUM ACTIVITIES

Cyber Surakshak

The program is a part of Cyber forum intended to promote awareness among children on cyber safety. The program aims at educating children up to grade 10 on various issues of internet, safety precautions to be observed while on the web. As we are aware of the fact that, internet and its usage has become the need of the hour for one and all. The most risk prone areas are the children, the future of this country, who needs to be educated and trained to defend from these vulnerabilities.



This program was launched in the neck of time when the pandemic had become the new normal and everyone started using the virtual portal for everything from studying to working. That is when Hyderabad City Security Council has come up with the idea of making students aware of the crimes happening in the cyber world. HCSC has partnered with WNS Cares Foundation (WCF) and launched the CyberSmart portal and around 15 schools attended the orientation of the WNS Care foundation. Currently the orientation with schools is in progress and reaching out to other schools in Hyderabad city to take up the gamified course to help students to be aware of being safe whilst using internet. We have completed the orientation of around 9 schools which have close to 6000 students who are taking up the course as on date.








Cop Vs Covid Book
